**The exhibition “Containers Love Disorder”
brings to the Kunst Halle Sankt Gallen:**

- ▶ order and disorder,
- ▶ remaining goods and their stories,
- ▶ many other stories,
- ▶ artists working in Switzerland.

Disorder is not simply bad.

Disorder can mean:

- ▶ resistance and new beginnings,
- ▶ reorganisation,
- ▶ love of chaos,
- ▶ longing to be different.

“Bibliothèque” is French for library.
Ready-mades are everyday objects
that often go unnoticed
and become artworks.
You can see these artworks in the exhibition.

You can place an object in a container
and give it to the library.
Many smaller items fit into larger containers.



Kelly Tissot shows 4 artworks.

Many photos of teddy bears fit into
the black and brown frames.
The photos are from a teddy bear collection.
The teddy bears are old.
The photos and picture frames are new.
The frames are containers for memories
of teddy bears and other things.
You cannot see any people in the photos.
But someone has put the teddy bears there.



**Paulo Wirz exhibits artworks
with old and new objects.**

Many objects fit into the artworks:

- ▶ broken glasses,
- ▶ candles and bottles,
- ▶ dried branches,
- ▶ lamps and light bulbs,
- ▶ chains with beads.

These objects come from many people.



Dominic Michel is showing a film.

The film lasts 1 hour and 30 minutes.
Many shorter scenes and music pieces
fit into the long film:

- ▶ scenes of car journeys,
- ▶ excerpts from video games,
- ▶ crowds of people and buildings,
- ▶ many music pieces,
for example by:
Patty Pravo or Ludwig van Beethoven.

The film is a container
for life situations and moods.

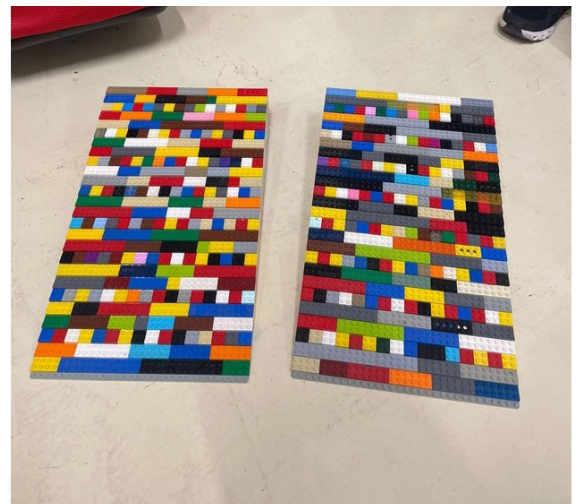


With his art, Matthias Sohr wants to:

The machine is working away.

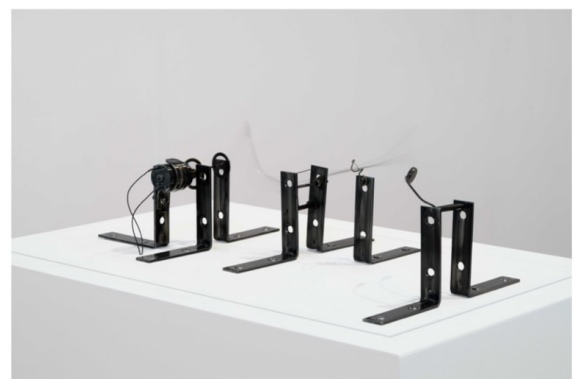
It is not clear:
